**SEN. BERNIE SANDERS:** An indefatigable champion of progressive causes, Bernie Sanders was elected to the U.S. Senate in 2006 after serving 16 years in the House of Representatives. He is the longest serving independent member of Congress in American history.

**NAOMI KLEIN:** Ms. Klein is an award-winning journalist, syndicated columnist, and author of the bestseller *The Shock Doctrine: The Rise of Disaster Capitalism*. Her forthcoming book, *This Changes Everything: Capitalism vs. the Climate*, is due in stores on September 16.



**CHRIS HEDGES:** A Pulitzer Prize winner and the author of *Days of Destruction, Days of Revolt* and *Death of the Liberal Class*, Mr. Hedges is now a weekly columnist for [Truthdig.com](http://Truthdig.com) and is a senior fellow at The Nation Institute in New York City.



**KSHAMA SAWANT:** Ms. Sawant made international news in 2013 by becoming the first socialist to be elected to office (city council) in Seattle in more than a century. Her trailblazing campaign spearheaded the successful movement to pass a \$15-per-hour minimum-wage law in Seattle.
